Acrostics

An **Acrostic** is a poem or other composition wherein the initial letters form a vertical word or phrase, or are in alphabetical sequence.

In Holy Scripture, the greatest **acrostic** of all, is the entire 119th Psalm. This Psalm contains 176 verses, with eight verses devoted to each of the twenty-two letters of the Hebrew alphabet. (22 \times 8 = 176).

The first eight verses begin with the first letter of the Hebrew alphabet, aleph. The second group of eight verses, each begin with the second letter of the Hebrew alphabet, beth. This arrangement and sequence continues entirely on through all twenty-two letters of the Hebrew alphabet...

Bible students have prepared a man-made **acrostic**, based upon John 3:16:

God so loved the world, that He gave His
Only begotten
Son, that whosoever believeth in Him should not
Perish, but have
Everlasting
Life.
