

Beryllus: Champion of Oneness

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Ye *are* my witnesses, saith the LORD, and my servant whom I have chosen: that ye may know and believe me, and understand that I *am* he: before me there was no God formed, neither shall there be after me. (Isaiah 43:10)

Beryllus rejected the *Logos* doctrine of the trinitarians and taught the Mighty God in Christ Jesus...

Beryllus did not deny the pre-existence of Jesus Christ, God Almighty, but rather taught that the Son of God did not come into existence (except in the foreknowledge of God) until He was born of the virgin Mary (having been conceived of the Holy Ghost in her womb).

A son cannot exist until he is born or conceived in the womb. But the Spirit of God (the Father) which dwelt in the Son (His flesh) has always existed and always shall. And so Beryllus did not deny the pre-existence of the one Spirit, but denied the pre-existence of the flesh in which He (God) dwelt.

Since the trinitarians mistakenly consider the Son of God to be a different person from God the Father, they accused him of denying one of two Persons.
