Fundamental Revelation

The fundamental Scripture and revelation of the entire Bible is this:

"Hear, O Israel: The Lord our God is one Lord:" (Deuteronomy 6:4)

To be lacking in that foundational understanding distorts one's ability to comprehend the remainder of God's Word.

God's demands in indoctrinating His people and the generations that follow with that essential Truth was so great; He followed that command with these instructions:

"And these words, which I command thee this day, shall be in thine heart: And thou shalt teach them diligently unto thy children, and shalt talk of them when thou sittest in thine house, and when thou walkest by the way, and when thou liest down, and when thou risest up. And thou shalt bind them for a sign upon thine hand, and they shall be as frontlets between thine eyes. And thou shalt write them upon the posts of thy house, and on thy gates." (Deuteronomy 6:6-9)

Monotheism, or the belief in One Almighty God, was always a basic understanding throughout His Word. Only the heathens and pagans worshipped multiple nonexistent gods. The same is true today. Monotheism is still the Bible way. Having the understanding that there is only one God, we may apply that Truth to this verse:

"And without controversy great is the mystery of godliness: God was [1] manifest in the flesh, [2] justified in the Spirit, [3] seen of angels, [4] preached unto the Gentiles, [5] believed on in the world, [6] received up into glory." (1 Timothy 3:16)

Any student of the Bible understands these six things happened to Jesus Christ. Therefore, we must deduce that Jesus Christ was the visible manifestation of the One Eternal God!

Jesus Himself reiterated the importance of believing this essential Truth.

"I said therefore unto you, that ye shall die in your sins: for if ye believe not that I am he, ye shall die in your sins." (John 8:24)

As God commanded Moses, may we also teach these Truths to our children and make them central in our lives.

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
