Humanism is a Carnal Worldview

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Humanism is a worldview that consists of many different ideas, values, and philosophies, that emphasize humanity as the focal point of thought and reason. Humanism focuses on human values and morality rather than a religious experience and humanity is more important than following any religion. The conviction of sharing and caring for other human beings is the stated priority of humanism. A true humanist does not believe in a particular religion and does not believe in God...

Humanism shares some beliefs with Postmodernism and Marxism. In a Secular Humanist worldview:

- There is no God, no self-existing being. There is no revelation from God.
- There is no spirit. People are highly evolved animals but do not have immortal souls. There is no life after death.
- There is only this physical world; the here and now. Nature/matter is self-existing.
- Only things which can be proved through the scientific method are accepted as true. Science is in essence a god.
- Religion is viewed to be harmful, suppressing individual freedom, and is therefore aggressively opposed.
- Morals are based on human experience and needs, not on revelation from God. Morals are situational and not absolute.
- All forms of sexual expression between consenting adults are acceptable. Abortion for any cause and euthanasia is acceptable.
- Self-realization is the highest goal of each human.
- Humans are viewed as inherently perfectible.
- Religion is preventing people from fulfilling their full potential.
