## **Identifying Seeds and Fruit**

There is more than one reason why seeds come in a package. Not only are they small and a challenge to hold on to, but most modern backyard gardeners can only recognize a few seeds for what they really are; thus, the package gives identity. Many seeds have distinct differences that aid in knowing their kind, but there are seeds that look very similar and yet bear different fruit.
