Strength-Faith-Glory

Each of these words shares a particular arrangement in the scriptures.

Psa 84:5 Blessed *is* the man whose strength *is* in thee; in whose heart *are* the ways *of them*.

Psa 84:7 They go from strength to strength, *every one of them* in Zion appeareth before God.

Rom 1:16 For I am not ashamed of the gospel of Christ: for it is the power of God unto salvation to every one that believeth; to the Jew first, and also to the Greek. Rom 1:17 For therein is the righteousness of God revealed from faith to faith: as it is written, The just shall live by faith.

2Co 3:18 But we all, with open face beholding as in a glass the glory of the Lord, are changed into the same image from glory to glory, *even* as by the Spirit of the Lord.

The phrases indicate an increase of more; "from" - "to"; from strength to strength, from faith to faith, and from glory to glory.

Strength to strength illustrates increasing courage. To be encouraged is to be increased with power and boldness to keep going on.

Faith to faith illustrates increasing confidence. Confidence gives one increased conviction.

Glory to glory illustrates increasing conversion. Conversion brings ever-increasing change.

Living for God is not to be a stagnant relationship. There must be movement and a stirring up of the gift. True, you do need some rest from the weariness of everyday living; nevertheless, you must not allow yourself to become immobilized.

You may be strong, but you must become stronger. You may have faith, but you will need to increase your faith. You may be living gloriously, but you still need to go higher in Him.
