<sup>&</sup>quot;High Priest, Supreme Bishop."

<sup>&</sup>quot;Key-Bearer of the Kingdom of Heaven."

<sup>&</sup>quot;Supreme Chief; Most powerful Word."

<sup>&</sup>quot;Vicar of Christ."

<sup>&</sup>quot;Sovereign Bishop of Bishops."

<sup>&</sup>quot;Ruler of the House of the Lord."

<sup>&</sup>quot;Apostolic Lord and Father of Fathers."
